Whether they gravitate toward community or international development, education, social service, public policy, or politics, students will find a vast array of opportunities through the UChicago Careers in Public and Social Service (UCIPSS) program.

Advising

Career Advancement provides the preparation, connections, and opportunities for students to pursue their career goals. Career Advancement has a staff of public and social service advisers with a wide range of experience in these sectors. These experts advise College students of any major, once they determine they have an interest in a career in public or social service.

Academic Courses

UCIPSS partners with the School of Social Service Administration, Urban Education Institute, and the Harris School of Public Policy to offer courses that provide an academic framework for examining social issues and concerns of interest to UCIPSS students.

UCIPSS Scholars Program

The UCIPSS Scholars Program is a selective program for fourth-year undergraduates seeking a post-graduation career in public or social service. During the quarter, students attend bi-weekly job search and professional skills workshops. Scholars receive one-on-one career advising and direct referrals to employers and alumni with professional opportunities.

University of Chicago Public Interest Program

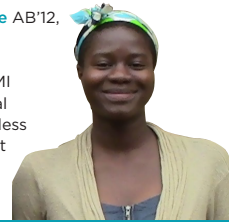
This program places graduating UChicago students in full-time, yearlong fellowships in non-profit, education, or public interest organizations that offer unique training and educational experiences. On-Campus Recruiting

The On-Campus Recruiting Program brings representatives from many top public sector, non-profit, and social service organizations to campus to interview students for summer internships and full-time opportunities. The UCIPSS advisers help identify internship opportunities and aid students in creating targeted application materials as well as prepare for interviews. Career Advancement hosts hundreds of organizations on campus through its recruiting program and career fairs. Additional organizations recruit via University of Chicago-specific job postings, resulting in thousands of internship and full-time opportunities for students. These encompass a wide range of public service sectors—including public policy, non-profit, government, and international policy and development—in locations across the United States and around the world. The Recruiting Immersion Camp is a two-day intensive workshop designed to build resume-writing, interviewing, and networking skills, as well as bolster self-confidence as students prepare for their job searches. It is open to all students.
